





How this all happened...

When I was a kid, I was a huge Allman Brothers fan. Duane Allman was one of my biggest musical heroes. I had always had a fascination with Duane and his music. I was always very familiar with Duane's quitars, especially his Goldtop. Having pictures of this quitar on my wall as a kid, I loved slide quitar and I kept up the Allman Brothers for many years. The music was dear to my heart, and I believed in a song having

The Goldtop was something I had always wanted to see, if it exsisted. After doing research back in the day on Duane, I knew that it was the quitar Daune had used on Layla, as well as other sessions at Muscle Shoals, and the Allman Brothers albums. I never dreamed, in a million years, I would get to do a album with it.

In the winter months of 2010, in my travels I met a man by the name of Mike Boulware. I was then told the quitar actually exsisted and was alive and well. Through mutual converstation, and phone calls and emails. I then had the pleasure of meeting Scot Lamar - the man who saved the guitar from certain destruction. Scot had bought the guitar in 1977 from a local music store in Daytona Florida. Duane Allman's quitar had been stripped of its color, and had damage that only a expert could repair. Tom Murphy from Gibson and Scot Lamar, breathed new life into the worn and battered instrument with much concern and respect from where it came from.

After several converstations, meetings and just talking, Scot agreed to let me take the mighty gold guitar into the studio to cut this album. When I decided it was going to be a southern rock blues album, I called old friend Garry Harper to play bass guitar on the album. I told Garry about what I was doing. He was interested and brought another idea to the table. He told me of how he used to live beside Allen Woody from the Allman Brothers in Nashville and of their friendship. He thought it might be a special one a kind thing to bring in one of Allen's bass guitars for the session. This recording is what happened, with all respect to all parties involved.

Two of the most famous guitars in the world, from two totally different time periods from the Allman Brothers. We created these songs.. to make this album come alive there was so much magic that pushed this recording to bethat we just couldn't deny it's happeneing.

Getting these two guitars together was most definitely a once in a lifetime thing.

Garry and I approached this with nothing but respect, sincerity and love to where these axes came from. We created an album loaded with real songs and heartfelt emotion. We call this one of one album -
